Statement to the members of the Middle East Medievalists from the President of the association

It is my pleasure to welcome you all to the new year of MEM as your new president. I would like to start off by expressing my sincere gratitude to Stephennie Mulder for her insightful and forward-looking leadership as president until January 2023. She and the MEM board have ensured that MEM during its most trying years during the height of the Covid pandemic continued to remain strong and to make impact through critical initiatives, such as the sponsorship of medieval-themed panels at MESA, the overseeing of dissertation and book prizes in 2020, 2021, and 2022, the issuance of statements in support of peace in the region and creating opportunities for people of color through a dedicated fellowship.
